### From The Pastor's Desk

Marriage is a friendship where a life-long commitment is made between the two people. And these two people, a man and a woman, are to live the rest of their lives seeking ever-closer intimacy and sharing with one another. Marriage is "The intimate community of life and love..." (Par. 1603, Catechism of the Catholic Church)

This means that both husband and wife are to constantly seek ways to deepen their friendship and partnership with one another. It is not enough to own the same house, have the same children, and pay the same bills. Companionship and conversation have to be the food of love. When you were courting one another, your main desire was to be together. It often didn't really matter what you did when you were together – you just wanted to be with the other person. So maybe you went out for a meal, or took a walk, or just watched television. It didn't matter because you were together. That was enough.

In marriage the danger is in thinking that since you live in the same house and sleep in the same bed you must, therefore, be together. But you all know that is not true. Being together in marriage means first and foremost sharing yourself with one another. Being one flesh means not only giving yourself physically to one another, you also are asked to give yourself emotionally and spiritually to one another. To do this you need to talk – to share what is going on within you. You need to take time to listen to one another. And ideally, you need to pray together.

I have a very simple exercise I would like all of you married people to do when you get home. If you can push a pencil, you can do this exercise. When you get home, each of you should take a pencil and paper. Then draw a picture that represents you and your spouse. Leave some space between the two of you when you draw that picture. Now write or draw in that space anything or anyone that is an obstacle to you really being the best of friends and companions.

If there's anyone that regularly keeps you from being what you promised to be that wedding day, it's times for major surgery. Even your children were never meant to keep you from the time and focus that your marriage needs. In fact, the best thing you can do for your children is give them the security that comes from feeling that the love that came from is still going strong.

For many of you it will not be a person that divides you, but activities. In a marriage, it is easy to act as if you are not really married. You start to make decisions about your time without consulting your marriage partner. These may be about small things at first, but can gradually grow through the years so that you really don't spend much time doing anything together.

Once you identified persons or activities that keep you apart, then it is time to make some life-changing decisions. Build companionship through activities – doing things together. Minimize what you do apart, maximize what you do together. Make a plan. We all need a plan in order to accomplish any worthwhile goal: And so in marriage.

All of this means that you have to stay open to one another and to what will help your marriage. A man once brought a new radio, brought it home, placed it on the refrigerator, plugged it in, turned it to his favorite station, and then pulled all the knobs off! He had already tuned in all he ever wanted or expected to hear. Some marriages are in a rut and become rather boring because either or both partners have settled down for life – really settled down! Stay open to newness. Stay open to change.

May the God of love of always be the bond that keeps you together.
