From The Pastor's Desk

The readings for today could easily leave us confused because they seem to be at either end of the emotional spectrum. On one hand, we are told in the first reading that God will be dancing with shouts of joy on our behalf. Then, on the other hand, we are given a very stern warning from John the Baptist about the chaff that will burn in a fire that will never go out. What are we to make of these two extremes the joy of God over us and the threat of punishment? As with many things in life, it may be a matter of balance - even if a very delicate kind of balance.

Perhaps the Church puts these two kinds of themes together for us so that we won't be living our spiritual lives on some cloud far away from the realities of our lives. This can be a problem when people divorce their spiritual lives from the rest of their lives and live a kind of two levelled existence. On one level, they have beautiful thoughts and feelings and seem to think that nothing in life can go wrong. On the other level, all that seems to matter are the day to day realities of life, like money and food. We are urged to be joyful and happy in the Lord, while at the same time doing what we need to do in order to be following God's will in our daily lives.

He will exult with joy over you He will renew you by his love; He will dance with shouts of joy for you As on a day of festival. (Zeph. 3:14)

Are you able to sense what the prophet Zephaniah is trying to do with those words? He wants to leave no doubt in our minds about how excited God is over us. That's right! **God is excited over us!** Does that seem like a strange idea to you? We get excited over things or people, but isn't God beyond all of that? Many of us grew up with a notion of God as an unmoved mover — one who was not affected by anything outside of his own being. But, that is not how the scriptures present God and that is not the picture of God we get from Jesus who desires to gather us to himself as a mother hen gathers her little ones.

The notion of unmoved mover is not one that inspires many of us to devotion and love. But a God who dances with joy because of us — now that is a different story. The scriptures want to give us a picture of a God who is for us — and who rejoices over who we are. After all, we are God's work of art, are we not? Shouldn't God be excited about us? This season of Advent is calling us to prepare to welcome Christ. Jesus comes to bring the love of God in a way that no one and nothing else could possibly do.

Have you ever experienced a person who loved you so much that you could feel that love every time that person came into your presence? When that person was around you, you could not help but feel surrounded by their love. You could almost reach out and touch it. That is the kind of love God has for each of us. God is dancing with joy over us but what is even better is God's promise that God will renew us by his love. We will be made into new persons through the overwhelming love of God.

May we all come to believe this joyful and loving God and come to joy and love for one another!
