

From The Pastor's Desk

There are some things that make a difficult life even more difficult. One of these is the inability to allow ourselves to experience newness. Many of us are so caught up in old and routine ways of doing things that if something new hit us in the face; we still wouldn't notice it. We would still insist on doing things the same old way, day after day, until the day we died. We have to be thankful that not all people are like this, because if all people refused to see new things, then the world would have stopped moving forward many hundreds of years ago.

If some men and women did not have the openness to see how things were able to be done differently, we'd all still be living primitive lives. In not that many years, we have seen transportation go from horse and buggy, to supersonic jet and space shuttle. Communication is now as close as a smart phone, or the Internet. Medicine has probably made more progress in the last hundred years, than in the prior thousand years. All this because people were open to seeing new things.

In our faith journeys, it is equally necessary to be open to newness. The priest and the Levite in today's Gospel story are not prepared to deal with anything out of the ordinary. Seeing their fellow countryman beaten and lying by the side of the road, they don't know what to do, and so make the decision to become blind. They actually cross over to the other side of the road, so that they will not have to get too close to this person who is in distress.

Their own narrow view of life will not allow them to enter into the pain of this other person. It would be too disturbing to their daily routine to reach out in compassion to this robbed and beaten person. As you heard this story, perhaps you shook your head in disbelief. How could two religious persons be so closed to the pain of another person?

It seems to me that the most important question here is this one: *What are the obstacles that prevent me from seeing and responding to the needs of others?* It's true that we can't respond to all the needs that we come across. However, there is quite a difference between not responding to all the needs we see, and not responding to any of the needs that we encounter. If our first response is always to turn away, or to cross to the other side, then we have a serious spiritual problem – one that we need to thoughtfully look at.

Aren't we all God's children? We all need to see one another in this way, and respond with compassion and love when we see one another in need. May the Lord open our eyes and our hearts giving us the courage to reach out in love to all those whom the Lord sends our way.

GENERAL REGISTRATION for the 2016-2017 Faith Formation year is now officially underway through the months of July and August. Please be aware that class fees have increased as of July 1. Also, classes are already beginning to fill up!

A minimum payment of 50% is required for all new paperwork with the balance due by August 1 in order for your child to be placed on a class roster. Reminder statements have already been mailed so that you don't forget! Please don't wait till the last minute...It's so hard for us to plan for the appropriate number of classes needed and ensure we have the proper number of trained, screened adult catechists available and ready to go if we're inundated at the end of August. Sometimes, we simply can't do it. ***Plus, you have to pay your balance in full at the time of registration if you wait till August.*** So don't delay! You can stop by the Community Center Monday - Thursday 10:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. ONLY to obtain the necessary registration paperwork. If these hours are not doable due to work schedules, please contact our office so that we can work out other arrangements. Also, due to vacation schedules (since July is our only downtime), please feel free to contact the Faith Formation Office before heading over to ensure we are in the office to help you with your paperwork.

On-Site Faith Formation registration takes place Sunday, Aug. 7 and Aug. 14 after all the MORNING masses in the dining room. Food & Fellowship will be offered, courtesy of Community Life!

If you're looking to join our children's Catechetical Team for the 2016-2017 year, contact Deborah on how you can sign up to be a catechist, aide, hall monitor or substitute! We are always in need of adults to help out on Sunday mornings.

For Those Seeking Annulments

The annulment process through the Catholic Church is best explained in person by trained procurator advocates. Procurator advocates are trained by the Diocese of Dallas Tribunal and are appointed by the Bishop of Dallas. They are bound to confidentiality when working with a client. However, some information packets are available from our Adult & Family Ministry Office that give an overview of the process, if you wish to know more about the process prior to meeting with one of our trained procurator advocates.

If you are interested in knowing more about what is involved in annulment process, please contact **Veronica Houston, x26**.

Your divorce must be final prior to beginning an annulment process. There are a number of documents that need to be gathered to process an annulment. The procurator advocate will go over that list with you.

If you wish to have a procurator advocate assigned to you that is not connected to Holy Spirit, please contact the Diocese of Dallas Tribunal.
