From The Pastor's Desk

Perhaps today on the Solemnity of Epiphany of the Lord, we could look at one simple yet profound theme that comes out of today's feast: our need to give gifts to others, and especially our need to give gifts to God. In some religious traditions, today is the day when people exchange presents. The wise men came bearing gifts. Most of us are pleased when we receive gifts. But, often, we get more pleasure out of giving gifts to others. When we give others our gifts, we are able to say many things to those who are dear to us. Through our gifts we can tell them how much we appreciate them, or how much we cherish their friendship and their love.

Just what is a gift? A gift is something that we give to another person simply because we freely desire to give something to them. A real gift is not given out of obligation. It is given with a free heart. It's true, at times, we give gifts, not freely, but grudgingly. An occasion such as someone leaving their job or getting a promotion may demand that we give a gift, and so we do, but it could never be said that we gave it out of love.

But, when we do give from the heart and from a loving heart, we pay a lot of attention to the gift we are giving. We want to make sure that it is the right one that it says what we want it to say. In fact, many people agonize over choosing a gift. We take great care because we realize how gifts can mean so much to people. Hundreds of years ago someone said: "A wise lover value not so much the gift of the lover, as the love of the giver." (Thomas A. Kempis) Often, we get caught up in asking God for what we need, or what others need. We see it as a one way street. God, you are God. You are all powerful. I am nothing. Give me what I need. But, we often forget that we are also able to give gifts to God. The wise men came bearing gifts. What about our gifts?

Each time we celebrate the Eucharist we participate in an exchange of gifts. We offer the simple gifts of bread and wine to God. God in turn gives us the gift of his Son, Jesus. And, when we offer the bread and the wine, we are offering our lives, our work, and our love—in short, all that we are. If this is the case, perhaps we should briefly look at how we are preparing these gifts that we want to give to God.

When a husband and wife give birth to a child, and then watch that child grow, what do you think will give them the most pleasure later on life? Will it be the accomplishments of their children? Will they gain the most satisfaction if their children become wealthy or gain status in society? Parents may be proud of their children's accomplishments, wealth or status. But, that is still not the most satisfying thing for most parents. I would guess that most parents simply want their children to love them as long as they have life. Parents give so much to their kids and usually all they want back is the love of their children.

Maybe God is like those parents who give life to their children, and whose greatest joy is in being loved in turn by those children. We are God's children. Jesus came to encourage us to never forget that remarkable fact. He wants us to act like God's children, loving God and one another. Isn't this the greatest Epiphany gift we can give – *our love*?

One of our long-time catechists, Peggy Dover, will be heading to North Carolina for the next 6 months beginning the first week of January. We are going to need a catechist to fill her




